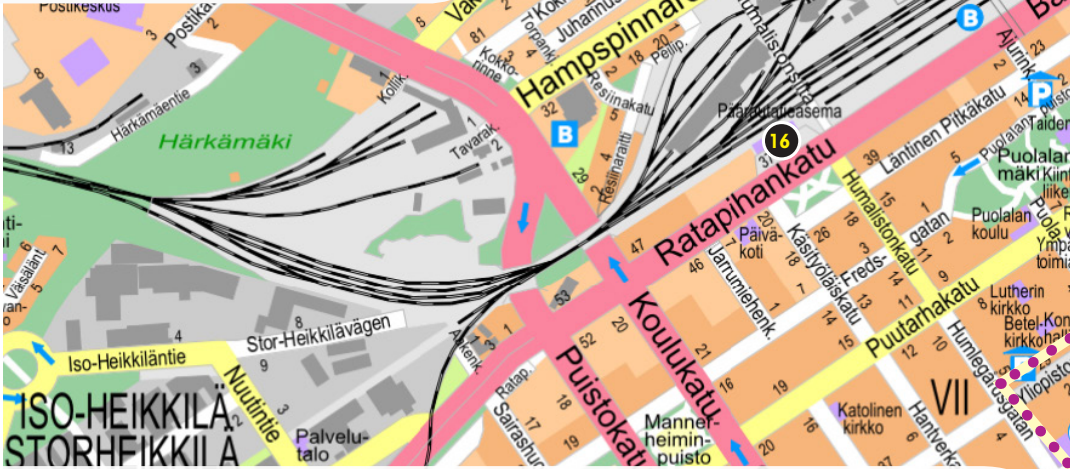
### SATURDAY 4/3/2017

## WELCOME TO TURKU!

To help you all navigate, we compiled a few key locations in Turku. On the map you can find different places for shopping, dining and evening entertainment (mostly situated within the **dotted line**) as well as your hotel and some sights to see. All stores accept most major debit and credit cards as well as cash (euros).

It is approximately a two-kilometer walk from the hotel (no. 1) to the central market square (no. 5), and the views along the Aura River side are some of the best you can find in Turku. More info on the local transportation can be found on the back.

If in need of relief during shopping, you can find public restrooms in Wiklund Department Store (no. 6, 2nd floor) and Hansa Shopping Center (no. 3, Herkku Store, basement floor) as well as in almost all the restaurants, cafes and bars.

Some sights to see are the medieval cathedral (no. 12, picture of the cathedral on the right) and the old market square across the street, all of the Aura riverside, the city library (old and new alongside, no. 8) and the old observatory (no. 14). If you have time, go and see the medieval Turku Castle (no. 13) a few kilometers down the river.

## OTHER USEFUL INFO

All tap water is drinkable.

Prepare for any kind of weather imaginable since it can be raining, freezing cold, snowing, hailing sleet, windy, slippery and blindingly sunny all within a single day. Waterproof footwear is advisable. Fingers crossed for sunny skies and mild weather!

## SATURDAY'S FIELDTRIP

On Saturday we depart from the hotel at 11:00 a.m. and head for Livia College in Paimio. The College has its forestry and animal care unit in Paimio and they have an open day. We will have a presentation in English, an opportunity to explore the institute and have some lunch if so wished (salmon soup, 7,5 €).

From Livia we will travel to Karhulampi, the same destination where the Wednesday dinner was held, where we can wonder in the wild, enjoy each others' company, have some salty pie and salad. (15 €, please reserve cash). The more keen explorers get a chance to be acquainted with the old traditional Finnish smoke sauna (towels provided)! We will head back to Turku around 4:00 p.m.

## SMOKE SAUNA

The savusauna (smoke sauna) is a special type of sauna without a chimney. Wood is burned in a particularly large stove and the smoke fills the room. When the sauna is hot enough, the fire is allowed to

die and the smoke is ventilated out. The residual heat of the stove is enough for the duration of the sauna. This represents the ancestral type of sauna, since chimneys are a later addition.

Smoke saunas have experienced great revival in recent years since they are considered superior by the connoisseurs. They are not, however, likely to replace all or even most of the regular saunas because more skill, effort and time (usually most of the day) are needed for the heating process (*Wikipedia on saunas*).
